

Bloomfield City Council Meeting
Regular Session
Feb 28, 2022 at 6:30pm

Council members present were David Clary, Donna Deardorff, Cecil Haley, and Pat Wilson. The City Attorney and Mayor were absent. Mayor Pro Tem Deardorff called the meeting to order. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence.

Jeff Goodmanson, Matt Schmitt and Logan Cowart, representing Nestle Purina-Bloomfield, presented the city with a check for \$20,000 to help fund the building of a new animal shelter.

Public Comments: Andrew Bohnert gave information pertaining to the warning sirens that Stoddard County has agreed to purchase and where these new sirens will be placed. One will be placed on the county farm property that is located across from the veteran cemetery.

Consent Agenda: Ald. Haley moved and second by Ald. Clary to approve the consent agenda. Motion passed 4-0 vote.

Updates: Allen Walker gave brief update of progress made at the lagoon. The new system is currently treating water, sludge removal will take place in March, and the generator is now set for delivery in October.

Unfinished Bus: Ald. Clary moved to approve the 2022 Stoddard County Emergency Operations Plan that had been submitted by Andrew Bohnert last month. Ald. Wilson second. Motion passed 4-0.

New Bus Ald. Haley moved to approve June 19 (Juneteenth) as an observed and paid holiday for city employees. Ald. Clary second. Motion passed 4-0.

BILL #2022-01 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 160.050, CONFLICT OF INTEREST, OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD, MISSOURI. Read one time and a motion was made by Ald. Haley and second by Ald. Wilson to allow a second read. Motion carried 4-0. Read a second time and Ald. Clary moved to approve Bill #202-01. Ald. Haley second the motion. Ayes – 4, Nays – 0.

Other Matters: Ald. Haley moved and Ald. Clary second that the City will replace two pieces of equipment that was damaged/stolen from a DPS vehicle. Motion passed 4-0. Emergency light bar - \$489; Firearm - \$399

Ald. Haley moved to approve the appointment of Anne Bye to the Library Board. Ald. Clary second. Motion carried 4-0.

After a brief discussion, council all agreed to allow Preston Flippin a 2 week extension on removing the mobile home from 806 S. Prairie St. Ald. Haley stated he would notify Preston and keep the council updated.

With nothing further to discuss, Ald. Haley moved to enter in executive session per section 610.021(3). Ald. Clary second. Motion passed 4-0.

Back in regular session. No action taken during executive session.
